

UEP is developing a Centre for Handicapped Students

The University of Economics, Prague is planning to develop a Centre for Handicapped Students during the following five months. The goal of this project is to make university education available for people, who have been until now more or less disqualified. The Centre will provide technical and study support especially for students with movement limitations and the blind. Applicants with these handicaps will be able to study at UEP as of in academic year 2007/2008. Application forms must be submitted by the end of February.

The Centre is going operate both at the Žizkov campus and the Jižní město campus. Its support should allow handicapped students to finish their whole study program and to get involved with student life more easily. "First we want to modify the space of the university to be without any barriers," says the Vice-President for Academic Affairs Felix Koschin. "After that we will start with intensive preparations so that the students will be able to use the centre by next term," he adds.

The Centre will be equipped especially to cover the needs of students with movement and sight limitations, but later it plans to also concentrate on the needs of students with other handicaps.
